This can cause backups in the public sewer pipes and at the wastewater treatment plant and related costs can be passed on to the ratepayer, THAT'S YOU. Even if its label reads "flushable" you are still safer and more environmentally correct to place the item in a trashcan. AND..... because homeowners are responsible for their sewer laterals to the main line, improper flushing can cost YOU money. YOU PLUG IT...YOU PAY FOR IT.

AND THERE'S MORE....

Whatever ends up in your toilet can potentially impact the water environment, so it's really important to keep household wastes such as cleaners, pharmaceutical products, paint thinners, stay out of toilets and drains and dispose of them properly.
